Taos Fall Hiring Event

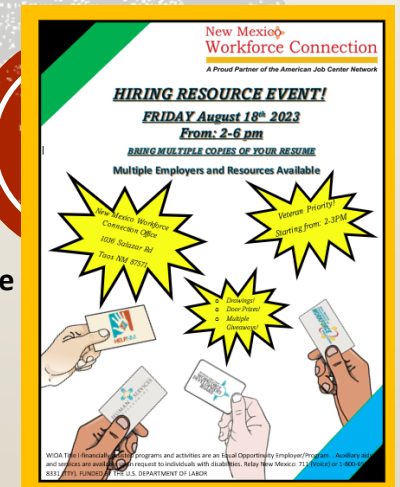
